This position, located at the Bend Empire office, is a full-time (40 hours per week/Exempt) position salaried at the wage of \$66,560 annually (\$32.00/hour). Additionally, we offer several voluntary plans including some family medical plan options, flexible spending, supplemental insurance, discount fuel, health club membership and pet insurance. In addition to these benefits, there is a 403b retirement plan where the employee is eligible to start contributing right away. After qualification period, the Agency contributes 5% towards this plan. Finally, there is a very generous leave plan with accruals for Vacation, Sick and Personal time off in addition to paid holidays.

The Energy/Weatherization Director represents the agency in local, regional, and national communities promoting sound organizational and management innovations. The Energy/Weatherization Director participates in staff meetings, strategic planning, developing short and long-term service goals and objectives, agency resource development and outreach. This position reports to the Deputy Executive Director of Programs.

- Experience with residential construction codes, construction cost estimating and construction management preferred
- Experience in completing home evaluations and energy audits preferred
